In the Liturgical Calendar the Christmas cycle ends with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord and Ordinary Time begins on the next day (Monday) and extends to the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday; it begins again on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday and ends on the Saturday just before the first Sunday of Advent. This year the gospel readings on Sundays will be taken for the most part from Mark.

Mark's Gospel presents a portrait of Jesus just as the other gospels do. Mark's portrait centres on the death of Jesus and on the meaning of suffering. Readers are invited to discover the meaning of life and death by radical trust in God and by loving service to others.

Mark, Chapters 1-8: Readers are drawn into a relationship with the powerful healer and preacher, Jesus of Nazareth. At this stage no one seems to grasp his true identity but whoever wishes to follow him it is by taking up one's cross.

Mark, Chapters 9-15: Gradual revelation of true Christian discipleship (10,45 – serve and not be served). This reaches a high point in his death on the cross.

Mark, Chapter 16. Death is not the end. The resurrection is proclaimed. Mark challenges his readers to respond to Jesus with trust and not with bewilderment or trembling.

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord: Jesus is anointed with the Spirit. He is proclaimed Messiah. He now goes about doing good, working the signs that make him known as the Servant of God. He is the one who brings Good News to the poor and tells of salvation.

To-day's feast is a reminder for us of our own baptism. We are called to be disciples of Jesus in the everyday circumstances of our lives. At the same time we are called to be members of the community of the faithful and so we commit ourselves to participating as best we can in the community.
