World Day of Migrants and Refugees, 14th of January: Some quotations from the letter of Pope Francis for this occasion: "You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God" (*Leviticus* 19:34). I wish to reaffirm that our shared response may be articulated by four verbs: to welcome, to protect, to promote and to integrate."

To Serve Human Life is to Serve God is the title of a message written by Archbishop Eamon Martin in the context of the debate about the 8th Amendment. He states — 'All human life is sacred. All human life is precious. This is why the direct and intentional taking of innocent human life is always gravely wrong.' He goes on to quote Pope Francis who said 'All life, from life in the mother's womb to that of the elderly, the suffering and the sick, and to that of the troublesome and even repellent, is to be welcomed, loved and helped.'

The Archbishop also says in his message: 'Ireland now has an opportunity to give even stronger witness that we value all life equally, we care for the weakest and smallest, the strongest and the healthiest, the youngest, the oldest and the whole wonderful beautiful spectrum of life inbetween. He urges us to pray that Ireland will 'choose life' and that the lives of all women and their unborn children will always be loved, valued, welcomed and respected in this country.'

Pope Francis in his exhortation about marriage and the family says: The Eucharist demands that we be members of the one body of the Church. Those who approach the Body and Blood of Christ may not wound that same Body by creating scandalous distinctions and divisions among its members. When those who receive the Body and Blood of Christ turn a blind eye to the poor and suffering or consent to various forms of inequality, the Eucharist is received unworthily. On the other hand, those who are properly disposed reinforce their desire for fraternity and their commitment to those in need. (paragraph 186)

Blessed Peter Donders (Redemptorist) was born in the Netherlands in 1809. He had to struggle hard to become a priest and in 1842 he went to Suriname, then a Dutch colony. He remained there until his death in 1887. In 1866 he joined the Redemptorist Congregation. His principal work, for 30 years, was with those who suffered from Hansen's disease. For these people he was not just a chaplain but also a nurse and an advocate on their behalf with the government. He also worked on behalf of the slaves and the indigenous population. He was beatified in 1982. His feast day is the 14th of January.
