A Prayer for Refugees

Almighty and merciful God,
Whose Son became a refugee and had no place to call his own;
Look with mercy on those who today
Are fleeing from danger, homeless and hungry.
Bless those who work to bring them relief; inspire generosity and compassion
in all our hearts;
And guide the nations of Europe towards that day, when all will rejoice in your
Kingdom of justice and peace.

08 November: To-day is a day of prayer for the Promotion of the Redemptorist Missionary Vocation.

09 November: it was on this date in 1732 that Saint Alphonsus Liguori founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, better known as the Redemptorists. Since 1876 there has been a Redemptorist Community in Dundalk which the people of the town and surrounding areas have always welcomed and generously supported. It is evident to all that the age profile of the community has increased significantly in recent decades and this is typical of the situation in Europe and North America. Clearly this state of affairs poses its own challenges but it does not change our conviction about the importance of our vocation nor about the significance of the purpose of the congregation “*to follow the example of Jesus Christ, the Redeemer, by preaching the word of God to the poor, as he declared of himself: ‘He sent me to preach the good news to the poor’*”. To-day you are invited, then, to pray with us for vocations to the Redemptorist Congregation.

14th of November, feast of Saint Laurence O’Toole (1128–1180) was **Abbot** of Glendalough and Archbishop of Dublin. He played a prominent role in the Irish Church Reform Movement of the 12th century. He became Abbot of Glendalough in 1154. In 1160 he became Archbishop of Dublin and was archbishop at the time of the Norman invasion. He mediated between the parties during and after the invasion. Archbishop Laurence began a policy of Church building and laid the foundation stone for the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity (now Christ Church). In a city that was in the middle of an economic boom, Laurence was seen as the one who cared for the poor and the neglected. There was appalling poverty in the city at the time. He also established care centres for children who had been abandoned by their parents or who were orphaned.
