Advent marks the time of spiritual preparation during the four weeks before Christmas. The Catechism stresses the two-fold meaning of this coming: "When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the

the long preparation for the Saviour's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for His second coming." Therefore, ponder again the great mystery of the incarnation when our Lord entered our time and space to free us from sin. But we also recall in the Creed that our Lord will come again to judge the living and the dead and that we must be ready to meet Him.

The Advent wreathe is a circle, which has no beginning or end. It is made of fresh foliage, because Christ came to give us new life through His passion, death, and resurrection. Three candles are purple, symbolizing penance, preparation, and sacrifice; the pink candle symbolizes joy, when on the third Sunday we rejoice because our preparation is now half-way finished.

The light represents Christ, who entered this world to scatter the darkness of evil and show us the way of righteousness. The progression of lighting candles shows our increasing readiness to meet our Lord.
