Gospel Reflection

Luke is concerned to show that the risen Jesus is present when his disciples gather together to share a meal in his memory. The three essential elements in this celebration are setting what happened to Jesus in the context of the Hebrew Scriptures and the breaking of bread. In our Sunday readings, the first reading and the gospel are thematically linked: sometimes the connection is more obvious than on other occasions, but the fundamental point remains, that the gospels can only be fully understood against the background of what we usually call the Old Testament. A homily is an explanation of the Scripture readings: a sermon is more of a class or lecture on some specific point of Church teaching. It is an interesting point from the Emmaus story that Cleopas and his companion are homilising as they make their way from Jerusalem to Emmaus. They are focussed on Jesus and what happened to him, but, without the Hebrew Scriptures, this remains an insoluble puzzle. The same message is forcefully conveyed in today's passage.

Launching St Joseph's Renovation Fund

Over the coming weeks, the Redemptorist Community will launch a special appeal to help us undertake essential work to the bell tower involving seriously corroded structural steel work that supports both the tower and the bells. Work will also include among other things, an electrical upgrade of the church lighting, the fire alarm, CCTV and the restoration of the benches which are in a bad state of repair. We will plan most of this work while churches are closed to avoid major disruption.

Over the past number of years, the Redemptorists have financed the reroofing of the church in addition to the installation of new organs and a new sound system. We have an obligation to maintain this beautiful church and appeal to your generosity in carrying out this important work.

We are conscious that this is a difficult time for fundraising, and so we have secured a loan for €350,000 to be paid off over three years. An a Audit and Steering group have been appointed to oversee the work and to arrange fundraising initiatives.
